Meet Scott. He has been living with Multiple Sclerosis for the past 30 years.


Earlier this year, he was set up with a smart home device in his room to help him achieve a few tasks each day.

# Confidence through Remote Care Management (RCM).

A broken ankle left Della in SJCCC's care for the better part of a month. As a patient in the Slow Paced Rehabilitation program, Della was enrolled in Remote Care Management, a 30 day pilot project that helps patients track their health once they leave the facility. This program allowed Della to manage her appointments, monitor her vitals and communicate with a healthcare professional 1-on-1 by video chat, all at the touch of a finger tip and at no cost to her.

When asked about her time at SJCCC, **Della raved**:

"To me, it was like a marvellous vacation! The staff were so kind and courteous. When I arrived home, the RCM program helped me track what I needed to do each day. I was sent daily reminders about the tasks I had to complete in regards to my health. It was all so simple to follow, and when I needed to ask questions, the staff were always available".

\* In just two short months, this new program has helped 30 patients transition back home.
