## **Executive Director's Desk**

Happy New Year to one and all and it is my pleasure to share with you some newsworthy items from Administration.

The Ontario government is working on the 2015-2016 Budget and we are working in collaboration with our member organization Ontario Association of Non-Profit Homes and Services for Seniors (OANHSS) on a pre-Budget advocacy campaign.

In this campaign, we are urging the government to increase staffing in long term care homes to improve resident care. OANHSS has recommended that the government make the necessary investment to support a provincial average of 4.0 paid hours of direct care per resident per day in Ontario's long term care homes over the next three years. We fully support all the recommendations put forth by OANHSS and are working to increase awareness of the needs including information sharing with our MPP, Residents' Council and other key stakeholders. This information is also posted on our posting board in the Public Gathering Space.

We are also working diligently to prepare for our upcoming accreditation survey in the expected to take place in March or April of this year. Surveyors from CARF International will be here to consult with staff members and interview people who use our services; namely residents, patients and family members and third party representatives; such as our therapy services provider and pharmacy service provider. We encourage everyone who is approached by a CARF surveyor to actively participate in the interview process as this is an invaluable continuous quality improvement process for our programs and services. Watch for more accreditation news to be posted in the Centre in the coming weeks.

## Health, Safety and Education

### **Health and Safety Physical Site Inspections**

This inspection was completed by an external consultant and is an annual requirement of our accrediting body CARF (Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities). The areas inspected within the facility were audited based on the requirements of, the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act, various regulations made under it, the Workplace Safety and Insurance Act, the Workplace Safety and Insurance Board's Workwell Audit, and best practices recommended by the Public Services Health and Safety Association (PSHSA). The report was received in September and we received a passing grade of 84%. An action plan was immediately developed to address the identified hazards. Overall, the organization (managment and staff) was commended for efforts to reduce injuries, accidents and losses.

# <u>Intergenerational Day at St. Joseph's</u> Continuing Care Centre


