Special thanks to the generosity of the **Kinsmen Club of Cornwall**, our Hotel Dieu Hospital will soon be home to a new Palliative Care Room for patients nearing end-of-life. Complete with Google technology and added comfort for the individual and their family, this space will be a private sanctuary for those closest to the individual to be close during their last days. We are blessed to have the support of community members like the Kinsmen who make these muchneeded spaces possible.





NEW STAFF HUB

Before the New Year is upon us, SJCCC will be home to a new space for staff to enjoy! Based on the concept of 'micro-markets', SJCCC is implementing a space for staff to refuel and recharge during their shift. The Hub will be located in the former Woods Gift Shop beside the cafe. We are excited about this venture and look forward to updating each of you once the door is opened!

REFLECTION ROOM

A work in progress, but we're on our way! Katie, our Wellness and Spiritual Health Coordinator, has been busy focusing her efforts on a new reflection room available for staff, residents and patients to use when they need a moment to themselves. This is an initiative brought to us by the SE Research Centre to encourage organizations to create a space to pause, reflect and share experiences independently or with a loved one. Several LTC homes have been involved in the rollout of this program and we are excited to launch!

Remote Care Monitoring: Results to Date

GREAT NEWS

Our Remote Care Monitoring (RCM) program at SJCCC has received additional funding and will be entering its 3rd year in our community! This program allows our staff to virtually monitor and survey patients enrolled in the program once they leave our Centre with real-time data alerting our RCM team. Patients are able to use secure chat and/or video call with a nurse, watch health teaching videos on-demand or based upon question responses and monitor their vitals via Bluetooth-connected health devices, all from the comfort of their own homes.
