The Heart of SJCCC

A new 2400 sq ft, modern physical therapy space will soon be showcased on the 2nd floor of SJCCC, joining Hotel Dieu Hospital and St. Joseph's Villa together. This space will be a hub for motivation, where patients can interact with one another, encouraging and inspiring each other as they strengthen and prepare for their return home. Residents in long-term care, patients in Hotel Dieu Hospital, and staff will be able to access this new space.

St. Joseph's Care Foundation has partnered with SJCCC and launched "Stronger Together", our fundraising campaign set to raise \$680,000 over the next three years.

Through partnerships, community events, and local support, the campaign will run until 2025 supporting rehabilitation programs. The new rehabilitation space is set to be up and running in March 2024! Rehab Equipment Needs

SJCCC prides itself on the ability to offer a variety of different rehabilitation equipment options to meet the needs of the individual. Here are some of the tools required to enhance the rehabilitation program at SJCCC:

1 x Pendulum Stepper: \$3,000

5 x Nustep Cross Trainers: **\$37,500**

3 x Bobath Bed: **\$15,500**

2 x Weighted Pulley Systems: \$6,000

1 x Leg Press: **\$7,500**

3 x Combo Weight Racks: \$7,500

5 x L - Bars: **\$2,000**

1 x Upright Bike: **\$3,000**

2 x Rehab Treadmill: \$6,000

1 x Bariatric Parallel Bars: \$3,000



Project AMPLIFI

We are proud to announce that we have had a successful rollout of AMPLIFI, a province-led initiative that allows long-term care homes, like ours, to send and/or receive resident and patient information electronically to other care facilities, when needed. This initiative leads to safer care for residents and patients and allows for seamless transitions and admissions with our care partners.

In September 2022, we officially went live with the Ottawa Hospital, in a two-way exchange of information. In March 2023, five local long-term care homes, including SJCCC, began this journey with Cornwall Community Hospital.

We look forward to keeping you up-to-date as we continue to move through this wonderful initiative.
