# News from our RCM Program in Hotel Dieu Hospital

**Great news!** Our Remote Care Monitoring (RCM) program has received funding for a third year! You may not know this, but in order to run our RCM program, we need to apply for new funding each year. We are proud to be able to offer a service like this to our community.

# When a patient leaves our rehabilitation program, they are enrolled in RCM and followed by a nurse for up to 30 days.

There is **no cost** for this program and SJCCC provides all the technology required to the patient once at home. The goal of this program is to help support the patient fully and reduce the need for unnecessary Emergency Department visits during a high period of uncertainty. The program also partners with Cornwall and SDG Paramedic Services and the Geriatric Emergency Management (GEM) nurses at Cornwall Community Hospital to provide extra support for our seniors. Since its inception, our RCM program has provided additional support for **893 patients**.
