Our new 2400-square-foot physical therapy space is getting set to officially open on **June 6, 2024**! It's been a busy year at SJCCC but we're almost there.

In 2023, SJCCC began construction to enhance its rehabilitation program offered in Hotel Dieu Hospital. Each year, the program sees 400+ patients who spend anywhere from two weeks to 90 with us after suffering from an illness, injury, or surgery. The goal is for the individual to strengthen and feel confident enough to return home and back into the community.

Before the build, patients were utilizing the hallways and converted spaces to start their rehabilitation journey. The added space is going to be a wonderful addition to an already successful program. We are excited to see the benefits this space will bring to our staff and patients.



# MEET YOUR REMOTE CARE MONITORING (RCM) TEAM

Shannon, Taylor, and Mandy are here to support your transition home!



We're here to support our patients on their wellness journey once they are discharged from the hospital and avoid unnecessary Emergency Department visits.

Patients enrolled in RCM come to us in several ways. We follow all of our discharging patients from SJCCC and take referrals from Cornwall Community Hospital's (CCH) Geriatric Emergency Management (GEM) nurse and Rehabilitation unit, and the Cornwall Paramedic program. We also have taken referrals from the CCH's Geriatric Day Program, Carefore Wellness Clinic, Marie de la Ferre apartments, and self-referrals.

#### Here's a brief walk through the day of our RCM Team:

First, we review your data and assess who needs the most support at the start of the day. We call our patients, either by phone or we will Facetime on the tablet, depending on your preference. We work with your care plan tailored specifically to help you to achieve your goals. This could include items like fall prevention, stable vitals, increasing health literacy, taking your medications properly and so much more.

We spend our time assessing vitals, reviewing answers to questions from the tablet, and acting on the data, helping patients understand their diagnosis, understand how to take their medication properly, getting the services in their homes that the patient needs, supporting caregivers in their role, speaking with their primary care provider when there is a change in condition and much more. We look forward to meeting you!
