Records the heart's electrical activity, helping healthcare staff detect heart problems and monitor heart health.



WOUND VAC DEVICE

\$23,000

Gently uses suction to remove fluid and help draw the edges of a wound together, which speeds healing and reduces infection risk.



CONVECTION OVENS

\$10,000

Perfect for preparing large batches in a main kitchen – perfect for SJCCC and its 208 residents and patients.

REMOTE CARE MONITORING (RCM) ...by the numbers

Guided by the Geriatric Rehabilitation Pathway, SJCCC's Remote Care Monitoring (RCM) Program supports a smooth transition from hospital to home for frail older adults. This 30-60 day program is offered in both official languages and is tailored for patients experiencing changes in their health or medications, or recovering from illness, injury, surgery, or hospitalization.

Whether referred from hospital or community, patients receive personalized, goal-oriented care plans aligned with the Registered Nurses' Association of Ontario (RNAO) Best Practice Guidelines for Care Transitions. For eligible patients, the RCM Program provides support through daily questions and monitoring of vital signs and regular virtual check-ins by a dedicated nurse, helping to reduce unnecessary hospital visits, enhance patient safety, and support recovery at home.


